Recipe Strip – Pancakes!

Ingredients:

- ☐ 1 ½ cups flour
- ☐ 3 ½ teaspoons baking powder

3. c. In a large bowl, pour milk, egg, and melted butter. Mix well.
4. d. Pour ¼ cup of the mixture into the pan to make one pancake.
5. e. Mix flour, baking powder, salt, and sugar. This is the pancake mix.
6. f. If the bottom of the pancake turns brown, flip the pancake.
7. g. Warm up the frying pan at medium-high heat.

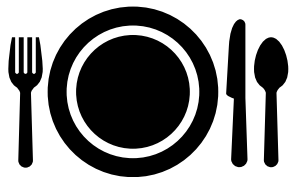
